This past Sunday, during the Installation Service, we participated in a joint covenant between myself, Church of the Open Arms, Cathedral of Hope, and the Kansas-Oklahoma UCC Conference. Let us linger over these words, hopes, and promises as our futures unfold together over the coming years.

### **Greetings from the Finance Team!**

The first quarter of 2016 is behind us. We worked really hard during the budgeting process to prepare a bare bones, realistic budget for 2016. The result was an almost 40% reduction in the monthly operating requirements for the church. In January and February, collections were not enough to meet the reduced monthly requirement; however, in March (which included Easter Sunday) collections were right at the Budgeted expense amount. In order for the Church to continue to operate and meet our financial obligations, offerings and financial gifts must equal our exceed budgeted and actual expenses.

The Finance team is asking everyone, to prayerfully review and consider their financial giving to the church. Our monthly shortfall has been around \$2,000. If each of us can find just a bit more to add our monthly giving we can achieve, financially, what we have planned to do in 2016. Regular, accountable giving is a spiritual practice that will change your life and the way that you regard money. All Gifts are needed and encouraged.

If you are curious about Church finances, anyone is welcome to join the finance team's regular monthly meeting. The team usually meets on the second Sunday of the month right after the Worship Service.




